Last year, the Lord miraculously created and provided for CCA. We started



a school that focused on removing the tuition barrier, and it looked impossible for us to meet our financial needs. However, each week, God showed up to take care of us.

In Luke 17, ten men with leprosy are miraculously cured by Jesus, but only one returns to thank Him. Instead of praising the one leper, Jesus asks where the other nine are. We've decided at CCA to use this story as an example for us. Therefore, we have dedicated this entire year as a year to praise and thank God for His faithfulness.
