CCA—Building a Culture of Service

At Community Christian Academy, we understand that we are not just educating the mind, we are instilling values that our children will carry into adulthood. One of those values in which we invest time is a passion for service to others.

Every month or two, we choose a community service project where our entire school can serve. This year, we began by working with Advancing Native Missions to collect jeans, backpacks, and socks for persecuted Christians in Egypt. Over the last few years, Christian churches, businesses, and homes have been burned and destroyed.

While we collected these needed items, we also used the opportunity to study ancient and modern-day Egypt, and we were delighted to have an Egyptian

missionary come to the school to describe both the persecution he has endured and the opportunities he has had sharing the Gospel with his fellow Egyptians.

It was our pleasure to deliver multiple boxes and bags of clothing and backpacks



to the headquarters for Advancing Native Missions in October.

In November, we were again pleased to serve as our students helped in the Operation Christmas Child collection center. Students helped pack and label boxes

of toys, candy, and toiletries for needy children. These shoeboxes were shipped to the main distribution center in North Carolina before being shipped overseas to children in impoverished and war-torn countries.

This month, our attention turned to serving those who spend their time and energy serving us—our area's pastors. We were blessed to have several pastors from a variety of local churches come to our school so that we could serve them. Our children led our pastors in praise and worship, and after Pastor Todd Cothran of CrossLife Community Church

gave a word of encouragement to his pastoral colleagues, our children broke into groups and prayed for the individual pastors. After our chapel service, our students served the pastors lunch. We love to be servants in our community!

I am often asked how we can offer such an excellent, comprehensive program when tuition provides so little towards our needs. Part of that answer is having dedicated and talented volunteers who provide important services to our school.
