As a homeschool graduate myself, it was a familiar process. But I had felt for a long time that I didn't necessarily feel "called" to a life of homeschooling my kids. I was prepared to do it if no other op-



tions were available, but I had prayed for some time that God would make it clear the path He'd like us to take. We made it through kindergarten and first grade, and I enjoyed the time spent teaching her how to read, how to add, and how to learn. During that time, we also had a preschool-aged son and added a baby sister to the mix as well. It was challenging but rewarding.

Second grade started off with a bang, and we were having fun discovering ancient history and more complex mathematics. We relished trips to the library and the time spent as a family. But by the second semester, things were changing. We found out we were expecting baby number four, and I found myself increasingly discouraged and exhausted. I cried out to God that I was ready to hand over the educational reins because motherhood of little ones was stealing so much of my teaching

Fundraising for Scholarships!

Already this year, Community Christian Academy has awarded nearly \$75,000 in scholarships to 75% of our student body. Our average scholarship award is almost \$3,500 (more than half of the \$6,000 tuition cost).

Believing that all families should have the opportunity to have their children in a Christian school, CCA awards scholarships whether or not we have already raised the funds for those scholarships. Therefore, we are asking the community to help us raise the needed funds to allow children this opportunity. There are several ways that you can help meet the scholarship need for a child:

time. I felt my oldest daughter's school year was suffering. Something had to give.

At our church, I had noticed a "Box Tops for Education" box on a table in the sanctuary. I didn't give it much thought, assuming it was



for a local public school. A few weeks later, our pastor mentioned to me that he was on the board at a new local Christian school and that we might want to consider attending an open house to learn more. I dismissed it thinking it would be impossible to afford. He approached us again, and we finally decided it couldn't hurt to find out more about it. If nothing else, we would help spread the word and try to support

what this new school was doing - providing excellent and accessible Christian education to those who normally could not afford it. So one afternoon in March of 2013, almost exactly 8 years after our first child was born, I sat and talked with Kimberly Moore about

what it would take to have our daughter attend Community Christian Academy. It felt surreal, but soon after, we decided it would be best to send our son (a rising first grader by this time) as well.

Even as we signed paperwork and started the process of getting ready, we weren't sure how the Lord would provide the finances. The school's tuition seemed impossibly low, and yet we were a oneincome family with a fourth child on the way - our budget was already stretched to the edges. But our God is a God of the impossible, and He made it happen. The school provided us with a way to work

for part of our tuition, and the rest was a miracle.

As for our kids, they flourished in their first year at CCA. My daughter learned so much about working independently, and my son came out of his introvertshell and shocked me with



his capacity for learning. They both made friends with their classmates and loved their teachers. My husband and I were so impressed with their growth and maturity and have enjoyed hearing about their educational exploits. It was a great year, and they're looking forward to another exciting school year at a wonderful school. I give thanks daily for Community Christian Academy.
