

The 2025-26 school year has been an exciting one with the launch of high school, the addition of new students and teachers, and the purchase of our own school property! God has been working in so many ways, and we are grateful that many partners have joined Him in that work. This year, we launched Charlottesville's first Christian multi-pathway high school with seven ninth graders. By eleventh grade, these students will have opportunities to take college courses with our teachers who are currently being approved by Liberty University as dual-enrollment instructors, to earn certifications in mechanical or electronic engineering from Piedmont Virginia Community College, or be prepared for a construction trade through the National Center for Construction Education and Research. Even though our initial group of students is small, we are offering multiple paths to graduation because unique students have unique God-ordained destinies!

A PLACE OUR STUDENTS CAN FINALLY CALL HOME

It was a step of faith beginning the high school knowing that we would have to put curtains up in CrossLife's sanctuary to create make-shift classrooms, and without a God-sized miracle to bring us a new building, tenth-grade couldn't be added next year – thereby ending our high school almost as soon as it started. Without significant financial resources, we couldn't possibly afford to rent a commercial property, much less buy one, but CCA's prayer team faithfully bombarded Heaven every Friday morning for six months knowing that God was able to do abundantly more than we could think or ask Welcome to 384 Worrell Drive – God's answer to prayer!



A MIRACLE MOMENT FOR PHOEBE LEE

Speaking Life and Truth into Our Students

Inspired by the biblical story of the boy with five loaves and two fish, we decided to launch a “Break the Bread” campaign to raise money to purchase 384 Worrell Drive. Like the story, our students gave “bread” and asked the community to give “fish” so that Jesus could multiply it. The first donor to that campaign was Phoebe Lee, a ninth grader who gave \$50 of her own money right before we started taping the appeal. While we were filming, a donor emailed a commitment to give \$50,000; God had multiplied Phoebe’s gift 1,000 times in fifteen minutes! Phoebe and her parents were amazed at this miracle; and we were blessed to invest in her spiritual growth that day. At CCA, inspiring faith in our students is every bit as important as developing their minds. The outcome of the “Break the Bread” campaign? – over 1 million dollars given in under 4 weeks!

Tax-Credit Donors Pave the Way



It was a delight meeting up with alumnus Elijah Anokye-Gyambrah in Richmond to protest HB359, a House bill that would have placed private schools under public-school control and destroyed their Christian missions if even one student were to be given a scholarship from a donor receiving any government benefit. In a press conference, Elijah talked about how important it had been to attend our school where he could learn about Christ, made possible with a scholarship through Virginia’s Education Improvement Scholarships Tax Credit program. At CCA, generous donors have given the same opportunity Elijah had to nearly 40% of our students, who will also learn to engage government and culture in bold but respectful ways. We are delighted to report that HB359 did not pass, keeping the way open for students to receive donor-supported scholarships!
