## Senate Bill 131—Where Giving Pays!

In the last state legislative session, Senator William Stanley sponsored SB131, a bill that provides tax credits for individuals and businesses that make donations to scholarship programs for K-12 students

to attend private schools. This law will take effect January 1, 2013 and will provide a **65% tax credit** for qualifying donations. When you give to Community Christian Academy's scholarship fund, you

can be sure that those funds will support children who otherwise would not be able to attend a private school. Incentives, like the tax credit, will help CCA raise needed funds to break the tuition barrier.

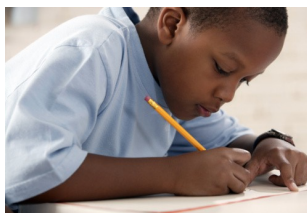
## Why Choose Community Christian Academy?

Unlike any other school in our area, Community Christian Academy has implemented a sliding scale tuition model to

increase affordability. This way, families from all economic backgrounds can enjoy the privileges a private Christian education provides. Families earning less than \$80,000 adjusted gross income in 2011 will qualify for a scholarship!
