Easter Season at CCA

We started and ended Passion Week with Easter egg hunts. The first hunt was part of our chapel service led by Gwendolyn Ferguson from Mount Zion First African Church. Using a set of Resurrection Eggs, Mrs. Ferguson told about the events leading to Jesus' death by opening each egg and showing the symbol inside. The children also hunted empty eggs to remind them of the best part of Easter—the empty tomb.



In addition, our classroom teachers spent their Bible classes reviewing each event from Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem to His death and resurrection. One afternoon, I could hear a teacher telling her class, “Jesus died for Mary; Jesus died for Isaac; Jesus died for Samaria . . .” She made sure that each individual child was told that Jesus died for him.

After a day focusing on the arrest, torture, and death of Christ, the teachers assured their students that there was a very happy ending to this seemingly terrible story. On the last day of school prior to Easter Break, the children reviewed the resurrection of Christ, made an art project depicting the empty tomb,



and had another Easter egg hunt, but this time, the eggs did contain candy.

It is a blessing to share the true reason for celebrating Easter with our children. When we know that “God so loved the world that He gave His only begotten Son that whosoever believeth in Him shall not perish” (John 3:16), we have a real reason to celebrate! We love Easter at Community Christian Academy!
